Long-term commitment to sustain efforts over 10-20 year period





The geography of upward mobility in Richmond shows racial disparities.


Kids who grow up in underprivileged neighborhoods will earn even less than their parents did when they reach adulthood.

5 components of success in collective impact.

Collective Impact: Structured approach involving a network of community members, organizations and institutions that advance shared action by learning together, aligning and integrating actions to achieve population- and systems-level change.

Common Agenda	Mutually Reinforced Activities	Shared Measurement	Continuous Communication	Backbone Organization
All participants have a shared vision for change, including a common understanding of the problem and a joint approach to solving it through agreed upon actions.	All participating organizations coordinate to identify a set of focus areas and implement aligned action to maximize the end result.	All participating organizations agree to track progress in the same way, allowing for continuous learning and accountability.	Frequent communications over long time period among key players within and between organizations and the public to build trust and encourage ongoing learning and adaptation.	Ongoing support dedicated to aligning and coordinating the work of the group.


